#### **Educational Opportunities**

Supporting Martu youth from Wiluna and the Murchison area to attend a range of schools and residential colleges across the State and assisting their parents and guardians with their enrolment and ABSTUDY applications.

#### **Financial Education**

Murlpirrmarra and Westpac initiative to help students set up bank accounts and provide them with budgeting information at our partnered schools.

#### Mentoring, Counselling & Rehabilitation

Providing 24/7 mentoring and connecting young people in need with counselling and rehabilitation facilities.

#### Advocacy
